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## Bad Weather, School Delays or Closures

This is a reminder that school closures, delays, or changes in bus routes, snow routes, may result from emergencies such as inclement weather conditions. School decisions are typically made by 6:00 a.m. after transportation personnel have examined the local conditions if we can safely bring everyone to school or we need to either delay the start of school or cancel school for the day.

When weather related emergencies occur, announcements are usually broadcast by the local television media (KEZI, KVAL, KMTR, KLSR) and announced on radio stations (such as KUGN, KPNW, AND KEED/KSND). The media obtains and broadcast their information from Flash News, www.flashnews.net. You will also be getting messages via the districts messaging system Blackboard in the form of a Robo call, text message and email message.

In addition, we will be putting out an announcement via Seesaw to our elementary families.

## Bus Snow Routes for Weather/Emergency

When road conditions are such that the district transportation system will be restricted the following changes in bus routes will take place. If there are no announcements transportation will operate as usual.

#### Hills Creek Road - Route C

The bus will turn around at the Jasper Christian Church at Hills Creek and Kenney Road. Students living beyond this stop will be able to catch the bus there.

#### Wallace Creek Road - Route C

The bus will turn around at Weyerhaeuser Road, just beyond 37047 Wallace Creek Road; students living above this road will be able to catch the bus there.

#### North Morningstar - Route F

This road will be BYPASSED. The bus will pick up students at the intersection of North Morningstar Road and Enterprise Road

#### Papenfuss Road - Route F

If the weather is such the bus can't go up Papenfuss Road, all students will need to meet the bus at the intersection of Papenfuss and Enterprise. This change will be announced.

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#### Lost Creek Road – Route H

The bus will turn around at South Rattlesnake and Quarry Road. Students living on South Rattlesnake Hill, Hanna Road, Harold Road, and Lost Valley will be able to catch the bus there.

#### Intersection of Rattlesnake and Lost Creek Road - Route H

Students from Lost Valley and the South end of Lost Creek can catch the bus at this intersection,

#### Lost Valley Lane - Route H

This road will be BYPASSED. Students living between Lost Valley Educational Center and Rattlesnake will be picked up at Rattlesnake. Students between Lost Valley Educational Center and Lost Valley Road will be picked up at Lost Creek.

#### <u> Rattlesnake Road Hill – Route H</u>

Student's Symptoms or Illness	Student May Return to School When		
Fever: temperature by mouth greater	Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine.		
than 100.4 degrees	And per guidance for primary COVID-19 symptoms.		
Skin rash or open sores	Rash is gone; sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage; or with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
New <b>Cough</b> illness or new difficulty breathing	Symptoms improving for 24 hours, no cough or cough is well- controlled. And per guidance for primary COVID-19 symptoms. If pertussis (Whooping cough) the student must take 5 days of prescribed antibiotics before returning to school.		
Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in one day OR not able to control bowel movements	Symptom-free for 48 hours.		

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Vomiting	Symptom-free for 48 hours.
Headache with stiff neck and fever; OR with recent head injury	Symptom-free or with orders from doctor to school nurse.
Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin	After orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse.
<b>Red eyes or eye discharge</b> : yellow or brown drainage from eyes	Redness and discharge is gone <b>OR</b> with orders from doctor to school nurse.
